

**Death & Glory** 



'Abram went as the Lord told him.' Abraham is the central figure from chapters 12 to 25 of Genesis and this one sentence, at

the start of chapter 12 after God calls him, sums up everything we need to know about him: he did what God asked of him. Just as he was called to follow, God calls each of us. In our initiation we answer that call.

But where does that call take us? At the end of the fourth block of narrative material in Matthew's Gospel, we find the story of the transfiguration of Jesus. It is a moment of divine revelation about Jesus' identity—just as, at his baptism, the heavenly voice



confirms Jesus as the beloved Son. To this is added the instruction that disciples are to listen to him.

Here they are up a high mountain alone, away from everyone and everything. It is easy to find God in the peace and quiet, it is easy to appreciate God surrounded by a majestic mountain-top view. St Augustine of Hippo, in one of his homilies in the fifth century, focused on this reaction from Peter: *Saint Peter was delighted with the* 

solitude; he had grown tired of the turbulent, troublesome human race. He saw the mountain, he saw the Lord, he saw Moses and Elijah ... He was delighted with this quiet, leisurely, blissful life, and said to the Lord: 'Lord, it is good for us to be here.' Why go down the mountain to be subjected to all that turbulence? Why not rather decide to enjoy ourselves here? It is good for us to be here. (Sermo 79A.)

The story of the transfiguration of Jesus is one rich in symbolism. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, the summary of the Jewish faith. As Augustine said in that same homily: 'In Moses we have the law, in Elijah the prophets. When we put forward anything from the gospel, we back it up from the law and prophets'. The transfiguration shows us a moment of glory, it shows us our destination. Like any kid in the back of a car, our question during this season of Lent is 'are we there yet?' The answer is that, although we can experience a part of that glory, although we get a taste of it every time we share in the Eucharist, we are not there yet.

We must trust in the mighty power of God's mercy, We are all sinners, but His grace transforms us and makes us new. - Pope Benedict XVI



The author of the 2nd letter to Timothy captures this reality: 'bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy'. Abraham's call led him to hardship, but he trusted in that call, even in dark and difficult days. Yes, Jesus has abolished death; yes, Jesus has proclaimed life and immortality; yes, the Lord will rescue our souls from death. However, the only way to life is through death. In the unintentionally profound words of the 1970s' musical, Jesus Christ Superstar, 'to conquer death you only have to die'.

Lent is our season of death. We must die to sin. We die to selfishness every time we tell the truth; we die to selfishness every time we forgive someone who hurts us; we die to selfishness every time we refuse to join in and spread gossip about someone; we die to selfishness every time we say a kind word to a stranger; we die to selfishness every time we offer a helping hand to anyone in need; we die to selfishness every time we reach out in love. Lent is our season of dying to sin so that we can rise to the new life of Easter.

We are thankful today for the faithfulness of Abraham, who went as the Lord told him. We are thankful today for Moses and Elijah pointing the way to Jesus. We are thankful today for Jesus, who showed us the way to life through overcoming sin and death. We are thankful today for our sisters and brothers who die to sin by listening and trusting in the faithfulness of God's Word.
