The Barren Fig Tree

This parable, found only in Luke, is introduced by the report of two strange events which only Luke recounts. The first seems to be an act of political violence committed by Pilate against some Galileans; the second is a freak accident at a tower being built at Siloam which is in Jerusalem. What both stories have in common is that a group of people met a quick, unexpected end. Jesus doesn't address the moral issues - whether their sinfulness made them worthy of such a fate; instead, he seizes a teachable moment and warns his hearers to repent lest they perish suddenly and unprepared.

The Third Sunday of Lent



In this context - repent now before disaster overtakes you - Jesus gives this parable of the barren fig tree. The owner has been patient, checking for three years to see if this tree would produce fruit. Now, suddenly and without warning, he announces his decision: 'Cut it down!' So far, this is a story that recalls the fiery preaching of John the Baptist: 'Produce good fruits as evidence of your repentance ... Even now the axe lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not produce

good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire'. But in the ministry of Jesus there is a gift of mercy and unexpected postponement of the judgment: the gardener pleads for one more year. He will take extraordinary steps: fertilising a fig tree was not common practice. But after this short delay and after these exceptional measures, if there is still no fruit, then judgment will fall. The time is short! This situation is urgent! Repent now!

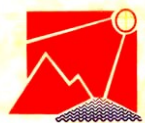
It is possible that there are veiled references to Jesus' approaching fate. He speaks this parable while he is on his journey to Jerusalem; the references to Pilate and violent death certainly alert readers to Jesus' violent death at the hands of Pilate. Jesus' preaching on the way to Jerusalem represents that last period of grace during which his hearers may repent. Soon it will be too late.
