The Final Commandment

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

This gospel is taken from John's account of the last supper. It differs from the others because John leaves out any mention of the bread and wine and speaks rather of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples. Our text begins with Judas departing the scene and continues with Jesus' words to his disciples. He is explaining to them that the events that are about to unfold, i.e. his passion and death, are not a disaster but rather the culmination of his life's work. His faithfulness to his task of revealing God has brought him to this point and so God is glorified in all that will unfold. Even though it appears at first sight that evil triumphs, nothing could be further from the truth for on the cross Jesus will reveal the glory of God who has 'loved us to the end'. That is why the commandment that Jesus now gives is so important. The disciples must love one another in the way that Jesus has loved them. This is what his life's work has been: to draw the disciples into the relationship of love that Jesus shares with his Father.





The strange sounding place-names of the first reading and the exotic symbolism of the second reading might seem far removed from our every day lives as we sit in the familiar church pew on a Sunday morning. So is there any point at which we can connect with these texts? If we have ever heard a homily or read a story which gave us new heart, or if we have ever been moved at the sight of a tear being gently wiped from the face of someone in sorrow, then these readings can speak to us. For they are all about encouragement. All of us from time to time need to know that we are not on our own, and we need also to be reminded that any words of encouragement that we can find for another are rarely wasted.

18th - St John I, Pope, Martyr 480-526. Remembered as a conciliator and peacemaker, the first bishop of Rome to visit Constantinople.

20th - St Bernadine of Siena, Priest 1380-1444. A Franciscan priest, theologian, reformer, and a popular preacher throughout Italy.

21st - St Christopher Magallanes (1869-1927), Priest, & companions, Martyrs. Parish priest & founder of a clandestine seminary at Totatiche. Commemorated with 21 other diocesan priests & 3 laymen. Martyred in Mexico, mostly in 1926-1928, during a fierce religious persecution which outlawed the celebration of the sacraments

22nd - St Rita of Cascia, Religious 1381-1457. Remembered for her life of penance and her suffering in union with Christ crucified

Minute Meditations - Prayer The Seed of Hope

Hope is not a feeling. It is not a starry-eyed assurance, cheery conviction, or buoyant confidence. Nor is it passive optimism that, despite the situation, bullishly

predicts, "It's all going to work out." It is beyond security and peacefulness. Hope cannot be bought or taught. It can only be received and awakened. Saint Francis instinctively knew this when, seeking discernment before the San Damiano crucifix, he prayed, "And give me...certain hope...."
