Salt & Light

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We continue the Sermon on the Mount this Sunday, with these two sayings about the salt of the earth and the light of the world. As Australians we learn early in life that whenever you go around to a friend's place for a barbecue you never talk about religion or politics. I guess it is because these are topics that can get people hot under the collar. For many in our society religion is a private matter. For some it is a way of showing respect for other people's different beliefs, for others it is a way of not shoving one's opinions down other people's throats.

Today's gospel tells us that religion for the Christian is not a private affair. It is meant to improve the lives of others. We are much more conscious today that too much salt in our diet can raise blood pressure, harden arteries, and lead to strokes and heart attacks. Yet, even dietitians and scientists agree that we need some salt intake. Of course, a little bit goes a long way. It is all about the right balance. As even a tiny amount of salt makes a world of difference, and as even a small lamp brings light to a dark room, so a small amount of Christianity in action brings benefit to our world.

Faith is to benefit others. True, it is not to be shoved down someone else's throat, but we must demonstrate the power of the Spirit. How do we bring the light into the darkness of our world? Third Isaiah (an anonymous prophet who was active in the years after Israel's exile) tells us: whenever we share our bread with the hungry, then we are a light in the darkness; whenever we shelter the homeless poor, then we are the salt of the earth; whenever we clothe the naked poor, then we are (again) a light in the darkness; and whenever we bring hope to the oppressed, then we are (again) the salt of the earth. Our faith is not to be hidden away, it is to be used for the benefit of those in need.

Yet, it is all about balance. Elsewhere in the gospels Jesus warns us not to parade our good deeds before others. St Augustine of Hippo explains the difference between parading our good deeds before others and doing good deeds for others. It is all about giving the praise to our Father in heaven. Augustine says, 'So when a person is seen by all to do good, his conscience should be prompted by the intention to do good, but not by any intention of getting well known for it, except for the praise of God and the advantage of those who get to know about it'.

So today let us thank our God for those people who share their faith with others, for those people whose love of God helps them make a difference for the better in our world. Let us thank God for those who are the salt of the earth and for those who are the light of the world. Let us thank God for those whose public faith does not oppress others but helps them, for those whose public faith is not for their own glory but for the benefit of their neighbour and for the glory of God.

Feast Days this week

- 5th - **St Agatha**, Virgin & Martyr, 3rd Century. Remembered in legend for her faith and for remaining resolute under torture.
- 6th - **St Paul Miki & companions**, martyrs. A group of 26 martyrs crucified at Nagasaki, 5 Feb 1597. Remembered as a notable preacher who inspired the local Church in his own time and in the centuries that followed to be strong in faith during persecution and isolation.
- 8th - **St Josephine Bakhita**, Virgin, 1869-1947. 'Mother Moretta' (our black mother) is remembered for her gentle good nature, humble faith, and gospel charity towards the poor and suffering
- 8th - **St Jerome Emiliani** 16th Century. Remembered for his care and education of orphaned and homeless children.
- 10th - **St Scholastica**, Virgin, 480-540. Remembered for her part in establishing Benedictine monasticism.
- 11th - **Our Lady of Lourdes**
