



faithful departed, entrusting them to the mercy of God who is life itself. As we name our loved ones and commend them to God's care, we are invited to renew our own hope in the resurrection and to live now as people of mercy, gratitude and peace.

The first mention of a day specially dedicated to commemorating all the faithful departed is found in a monastic rule attributed to St Isidore of Seville (died 636), who ordered his monks to celebrate the Eucharist for the souls of the departed on the Monday after Pentecost. The choice of this day may be due to the fact that the emerging feast of All Saints was celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost, following some examples from the Christian East.

The Irish connection - In 998 St Odilo of Cluny set aside the day immediately following All Saints (2nd November) as a day when "the monks at Cluny would keep with joyous affection the memory of all the faithful departed who have lived from the beginning of the world until the end". The custom spread to England and to Spain. In Valencia, the custom of saying three Masses was introduced by the Dominicans in the early 14th century. In 1915, during World War I, Pope Benedict XV extended the feast and the privilege of saying three Masses to the universal Church



All Souls' Day celebrates the same mystery as yesterday's feast of All Saints, though from a different perspective. Both feasts look to Jesus' death and resurrection and recognise that this Paschal Mystery is the hope of those who are baptised into Christ. All Saints however celebrates the fact that those who have been faithful rejoice with Christ in glory. All Souls remembers those who have died and commends them to God's generous care. The two feasts together recognise the ambiguity of human life after death and the mystery of our destiny in Christ.

1st - All Saints. This feast began in the East to commemorate all martyrs and was progressively adopted in the West. Celebrated on this day in the eighth century and soon widely observed.

2nd - The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities.

3rd - St Martin de Porres, Religious 1579-1639. Trained as a barber and infirmarian, he was accepted as a Dominican brother.

4th - St Charles Borromeo, Bishop 1538-1584. Prominent in the final sessions of the Council of Trent during and, at its end, was ordained presbyter, then bishop and became archbishop of Milan.

Minute Meditations - Broken in Spirit
