

THE ASCENSION OF THE

This is the second description of the Ascension we read today. However, it differs from our first reading in that it marks the end of the gospel of Luke. So as Jesus departs he reminds them that they are witnesses to his ministry and to his death and resurrection.

The final piece of this drama will unfold when he sends them the promised Holy Spirit through which they will be clothed with 'power from on high'. Then after seeing him depart they return to Jerusalem, full of joy, continually praising God in the Temple. The themes of the joy, the praise of God and the presence of the Holy Spirit have been to the fore throughout Luke's gospel, and it is only fitting that he should end his first volume on this note of fervour with the disciples eager to undertake their task.



We are reminded today that it is not the task of Christians to "stand looking up into the sky' either to mourn Jesus' departure from earth or to simply await his return. Our role until his Second Coming is to witness to him. This we do through recognising that we have indeed been clothed with power from on high. As his body, the church, we are to be Jesus' continued presence on earth bringing freedom, healing and forgiveness to all who long to know the true God.

1st - St Justin, Martyr 100-165. A lay intellectual, Christian philosopher, & apologist.
2nd - St Marcellinus & St Peter, Martyrs. Died in 304, beheaded at Rome under the emperor Diocletian. Reputedly members of the Roman clergy.

3rd - St Charles Lwanga & companions, Martyrs. Died in 1886. Between 1885 & 1887, these 22 martyrs were among many newly baptised Catholics & Anglicans who were killed for their faith & virtue in Uganda by a debauched and brutal ruler. 5th - St Boniface, Bishop & Martyr 675-754 An English monk & teacher who went

5th - **St Boniface**, Bishop & Martyr 675-754 An English monk & teacher who went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. Was ordained bishop and given wideranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. Honoured as Apostle of Germany

6th - St Norbert, Bishop 1080-1134. Remembered for his zealous reform of clerical life and for the example of his attachment to the values of the gospel 6th - St Marcellin Champagnat, Educator 1789-1840. Responding to the needs of his impoverished rural community, he formed a group of teenagers as teachers and religious educators, thus founding the Marist Brothers Institute within the Society of Mary



Minute Meditations - Healing the Wounded

We all know that the three cornerstones of the Christian message are faith, hope, and charity. I have heard many sermons on faith and charity, but few on hope. Hope, in many ways, may be the greatest need we have as we struggle to live in an increasingly troubled world. I've come to see that my own work involves helping people find it. Without hope, there is little motivation to face wounds, to heal, and to make changes.

Quite simply, the message is, "If I can heal, so can you." What wounded healers then do is to help each sufferer find within himself or herself the seed of healing. I cannot heal anyone. But I believe within each of us is everything we need to heal. We just don't always believe that. God didn't just dump us into this world with a pat on the back and a wish of "Good luck!" Rather, God, knowing how challenging life can be, equipped us with everything we need to cope and to grow. Most of us stumble along the way and lose sight of this. But take heart: God is with us always..
