Triumph

THE EXALTATION OF Today's feast of the exaltation or THE HOLY CROSS triumph of the Holy Cross is not like

Good Friday. Our focus is not so much on the sufferings of Jesus. Rather, we celebrate what the gospel reading refers to as the lifting up of the Son of Man. The term 'lifting up' suggests not just his being lifted up physically on the cross but also his being lifted up in glory. There are some depictions of the cross which highlight this double sense of Jesus being lifted up, where the body of Jesus



on the cross is almost glorified. You may be familiar with the cross of San Damiano in Assisi. When Saint Francis was praying before it, he heard the Lord call on him to rebuild the church. The image of Jesus that is painted on that cross has a glorious, luminous, quality. It is this kind of depiction of the cross that reflects the meaning of today's feast, which is the feast of the triumph or exaltation of the cross.

In what sense was the crucifixion of Jesus a triumph? It was firstly the triumph of love over hatred, the triumph of God's love over human sin. All authentic love is life-giving and God's love is supremely life-giving.

That is why the crucifixion of Jesus was a triumph in another sense, the triumph of life over death, of God's life over human death, a triumph in which we can all share. That verse in today's gospel reading which has spoken to believers down the centuries really sums up the meaning of today's feast, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him'.

Today we are invited to look upon the cross as the 'explosion of God's life-giving love for us all' and then to allow ourselves to be drawn into that love so that we can reflect it to others through our lives. Fr Michael Hogan.

16th - St Cornelius Pope, Martyr & St Cyprian, Bishop, Martyr. Died 250's. St Cornelius, supported by Cyprian, he defended the power of the Church to reconcile those who had lapsed under persecution.

17th - St Hildegard of Bingen, virgin, doctor 1098-1179, German Benedictine abbess, polymath, writer, composer, visionary, mystic and philosopher. She wrote in the fields of theology, botany and medicine as well as writing poems, chants. letters and liturgical antiphons.

17th - St Robert Bellarmine, Bishop, Doctor of the Church 1542-1621 A Jesuit remembered for his dedication to the truth, his charity in disputation, and his austerity of life

19th - St Januarius, Bishop, Martyr.

20th - St Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, Martyr, St Paul Chong Ha-sang & **Companions**, Martyrs. After more than two centuries of lay leadership, the Church in Korea was subject to fierce persecutions between 1839 and 1867. This feast commemorates 103 of the numerous Korean martyrs.

Minute Meditations - St. Francis and the Cross

Francis always mentioned humility in the same breath with poverty. In a sense. they are the same: personally doing without. This is a fact, because all that we have is from God. This is an ideal, because we want to be without everything but God. Some of the most striking things Francis said concern humility: "A man is what he is in the sight of God and nothing more." "The better a man really is, the worse he feels himself to be." The more we appreciate God's gifts and unending generosity, the more we become conscious of refusing to admit this and spoiling God's precious gifts.

As with St. Paul, the only thing Francis would take pride in was the "cross of Christ.".
