

The Next Step

This gospel text is almost the same one as

PENTECOST

used on the Sixth Sunday of Easter and it presents us with John's understanding of the unique and vital role played by the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer. The entire section of John's gospel known as the 'Last Discourse' (chapters 13-17) is presented as a kind of farewell speech or even last will and testament. Luke the evangelist explores who Jesus really is and how we, his followers, are united to him and draw life from him. To do this he uses a couple of key images: one is the 'dwelling place' (v.14), the other is the 'vine' (v.15). It is the Spirit in us who allows us to explore these ideas and to deepen our understanding of the profound mystery that has been revealed through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.




The feast of Pentecost brings to a close the season of Easter because the gift of the Spirit is the inevitable outcome of the death and resurrection of Jesus. The church understood clearly that what happened to Jesus on Easter Sunday was not just an amazing miracle to prove that he really was the Son of God.

It was rather the next step in God's desire to heal, once and for all, the relationship between himself and a broken

humanity. Now the outpouring of the Spirit of Jesus means that our relationship with God is fundamentally transformed. So let's celebrate of our new life in the Spirit and the birthday of the church as the new people of God.

The Jubilee Praver


2025 JUBILEE YEAR
