

BOMBALA - DELEGATE CATHOLIC PARISH IN THE MONARO MISSION

Country of the Yuin and Ngarigo people First Catholics arrived in the area from 1826 as assigned servants (convicts) Scottish, Irish and later German immigrants built up the presence from 1833 First resident priest Fr Patrick Newman 1864

Churches built - Bombala 1867 & 1942. Delegate 1877 & 1915. Cathcart 1878. Corrowong 1894 Schools 1866-1886 (privately Catholic), Bombala 1886, Delegate 1921

Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart (Mary MacKillop) arrived in 1888, continuous ministry for 128 years Monaro & South Coast Parishes transferred to Goulburn Diocese 1917

First priestly vocation - Fr Ernest Baragry ordained as Missionary of the Sacred Heart 1941 (died 1997) Delegate a Parish in its own right 1954-1972. Welcomed the World Youth Day Cross & Icon Feb 2008 St Mary's Church Bombala Consecrated 2008. St Joseph's Church Delegate Centenary 2015
