Country of the Yuin and Ngarigo people
First Catholics arrived in the area from 1826 as assigned servants (convicts)
Scottish, Irish and later German immigrants built up the presence from 1833
First resident priest Fr Patrick Newman 1864

Churches built - Bombala 1867 & 1942, Delegate 1877 & 1915, Cathcart 1878, Corrowong 1894
Schools 1866-1886 (privately Catholic), Bombala 1886, Delegate 1921

Pope Francis has selected the new Melbourne Archbishop Peter A. Comensoli to attend next month's Synod of Bishops on young people.

The National Council of Priests (who met last week) will push for optional celibacy and married priests in its submission to the Plenary Council 2020.

Pope Francis visited Sicily on Saturday to honour a priest murdered by the mafia 25 years ago while trying to save youngsters in poor neighbourhoods from falling into their hands.
