Welcomed the World Youth Day Cross & Icon Feb 2008 St Mary's Church Bombala Consecrated 2008. St Joseph's Church Delegate Centenary 2015

That Christ's call en route to Jerusalem is a radical call is echoed in the scripture reflection, 'Indifference to all the things that distract us is the way of the disciple.
