The Catholic Church dedicates November, starting with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, as the Month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory—those who died in grace but have yet to atone for all their sins. This reflects the Church's belief in the communion of saints, uniting us with those in heaven, purgatory and on earth. In November, Catholics are encouraged to pray for deceased loved ones and those who have no one to pray for them, reinforcing our unity in Christ. Pope Saint John XXIII expressed this beautifully, calling devotion to the dead "one of the most beautiful expressions of the Catholic spirit".



FINDING GOD IN OUR WORLD Remembering the dead

In Christian faith Christ offers life after death to all those who have faith in him. **Daily Prayer Intention** - We pray for the countless people who have fled or been displaced from their homeland, that they will find a safe haven which allows them to treasure their culture and community.

Weekly Prayer Intention - We pray for all who have been ordained to priestly ministry, especially Fr Mark Ha, that they will find joy and peace in the service of God's people.



A UNIVERSAL GRIEF

Pope Francis, in his November prayer intention, invites us to join him in praying for anyone who has lost a child, asking the Holy Spirit to bring them peace and consolation.

The loss of a child is often regarded as the most heartbreaking of all funerals, carrying with it the unfulfilled potential and dreams parents had for their child. This intense sorrow can sometimes strain family bonds, and parents often grieve for children regardless of age. The natural order feels broken when children precede their parents in death. The grief for lost children extends beyond personal tragedy to those affected by violence and disaster worldwide. Countless children have died in war zones like Gaza, Lebanon, Myanmar and Sudan, often with no one left to mourn them. In Australia, the grief also reaches those lost to drug overdoses, suicides and tragedies in prisons or homes. This shared sorrow reflects a global flood of grief, particularly for children who were undeservedly taken. Each story represents a parent's profound and universal sorrow. Pope Francis highlights the essential role of community support for grieving parents, regardless of culture, family size or circumstance. Often, people distance themselves by assuming that some parents may not feel grief as deeply, but this is false; grief knows no boundaries. The Pope encourages communities to stand by those who mourn, offering time, care and understanding. Grieving parents, especially those who feel isolated or separated from supportive networks, rely heavily on these gestures from their community and church. The Pope envisions a church that embodies compassion, like Jesus in the Gospels, who comforted and healed those in sorrow. Through acts of care, such as helping with daily needs and maintaining ongoing support, the Christian community reflects God's love. Pope Francis prays that the Holy Spirit brings comfort and strength to those mourning their children, sustaining them with hope in eternal reunion. This hope, while not erasing the pain, helps bear the weight of loss and reminds us of a future in which we shall be united with our loved ones again.

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

First Reading Dt 6:2-6

Hear Israel, you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.

Moses said to the people: 'If you fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and if you keep all his laws and commandments which I lay on you, you will have a long life, you and your son and your grandson. Listen then, Israel, keep and observe what will make you prosper and give you great increase, as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you, giving you a land where milk and honey flow.

'Listen, Israel: The Lord our God is the one Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength. Let these words I urge on you today be written on your heart.'

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 17:2-4. 47. 51. R.v.2

(R.) I love you Lord, my strength.

 I love you, Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my saviour. My God is the rock where I take refuge; my shield, my mighty help, my stronghold. The Lord is worthy of all praise: when I call I am saved from my foes. (R)

Second Reading Heb 7:23-28

This one, because he remains for ever, has an eternal priesthood.

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Gospel Acclamation Jn 14:23

Alleluia, alleluia!

All who love me will keep my words,

and my Father will love them and we will come to them.

Alleluia!

Gospel Mk 12:28-34

This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord you God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

Israel was called by God. To what was Israel called? To what were the crowds who followed Jesus called? To what are we called? To a covenant relationship with the Lord who is God, the one who is Lord alone. We have been invited into an intimate personal relationship with the creator of the universe, the one who plays with black holes and white dwarfs and at the same time with infinite interest has numbered the very hairs on our head (cf. Matt 10:30). We have heard this so often that it may have become commonplace. The marvel of it may escape our attention, because it has become just a part of our religious language. It is well that once in a while we are shaken to our senses, 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord is your God, the Lord alone!'

It is not marvel enough that this mysterious God has created us; we have also been redeemed. As victim-priest Jesus has offered himself on our behalf. He is the sacrifice that sealed the covenant: his blood was the explation for our sins; he is our rock, our fortress, our deliverer, our shield, our stronghold. Only one thing is asked of us in return: that we open ourselves to him and cling to the covenant, that we proclaim with all our hearts 'The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!' We are to love with all our heart and all our soul and all our strength; we are to love God and to love others.
