



THE MONTH OF JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART

We dedicate the month of June to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in veneration and in gratitude for His merciful heart and His redeeming love for mankind. Holy masses, novenas, and the recitation of devotional prayers in honour of the Sacred Heart are traditionally observed by the faithful devotees. Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690), a French Catholic nun, was instrumental in spreading devotion to the Sacred Heart after she had visions of Jesus beginning in 1673, when Jesus asked her to have a special feast established in honour of His Sacred Heart.

Looking Back 128 Years - 23 Oct 1885 Corrowong Ball

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The recent ball in aid of the funds of the Roman Catholic Church at Corrowong has received a glowing account as it realised £30 (approx. \$5,200 in 2023). It is highly satisfactory to all concerned that such a decided success should attend the efforts of the promotors. Corrowong has now blossomed forth as a prominent portion of the Bombala district. It has a church of noble dimensions and a post office.

Looking Back 79 Years - Oct 1944 Jubilee St Peter's Corrowong

The golden jubilee celebrations of St Peter's Church, Corrowong, took place when his Lordship the Bishop, Most Rev. TB McGuire, D.D., was present. The celebrations commenced with the Jubilee Mass, which was celebrated by the Rev. Fr Griffin. His Lordship the Bishop presided. Also present In the sanctuary were Fr Ryan, (Cooma), Fr O'Carroll (Pambula), and Fr Barry (Bega), who was master of ceremonies. Tho occasional address was given by the Bishop. The children from the Delegate Convent School sang the Gregorian March of Angels. After Mass a banquet was prepared in the dining-room of the shearer's hut at Corrowong Station.

Pope Francis meets with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy



Pope Francis has said an eventual return by Russia of occupied territories in Ukraine is a "political problem" to be resolved by both sides, in his first public comment on Ukraine's request for him to back its plan demanding a total Russian withdrawal.

In an interview, Pope Francis did not take a position on the return of territories as a fundamental condition for peace, something on which Ukraine and many of its Western backers insist. In the interview with the U.S.-based Spanish language network, Pope Francis was asked twice if Russia should hand back the territories. He did not address that part of the question the first time but when pressed again, he said: "It's a political issue. Peace will be achieved once they can talk to each other, face to face or through intermediaries. If they don't talk ... it's a political issue". Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskiy met the pope at the Vatican recently and asked him to back Kyiv's peace plan, which Zelenskiy has repeatedly said is not open to negotiation.

TRINITY SUNDAY



Falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, which is the 50th day after Easter.

The day honours the descent of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' apostles and followers. Trinity Sunday celebrates the mystery of faith and unity on and of the Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

BOMBALA-DELEGATE CATHOLIC PARISH - IN THE MONARO MISSION Country of the Bidwell, Ngarigo and Yuin People



The first Catholics arrived in the area from 1826 as assigned servants (convicts). Scottish, Irish, and later German immigrants built up the presence from 1833. Father Patrick Newman was the first resident priest in 1864. Prior to this, priests travelled from Queanbeyan and Cooma. Churches were built in Bombala 1867 & 1942 (St Mary's), Delegate 1877 & 1915(St Joseph's), Cathcart 1878 (St John's) and Corrowong 1894 (St Peter's). Schools opened in 1866-1886 (privately Catholic), Bombala 1886 and Delegate 1921. In 1888 the Sisters of Saint Joseph of the Sacred Heart, North Sydney (St Mary MacKillop) arrived and have provided continuous ministry for 133 years. Monaro & South Coast Parishes were transferred from the Sydney Archdiocese to Goulburn Diocese in 1917 and to the Archdiocese of Canberra-Goulburn in 1948. Our first priestly vocation was Fr Ernest Baragry who was ordained as a Missionary of the Sacred Heart in 1941. Delegate was a Parish in its own right from 1955-1973. 2008 saw the welcoming of the World Youth Day Cross & Icon and the Consecration of St Mary's Church Bombala following repairs and restoration. St Joseph's Church Delegate celebrated its Centenary in 2015.

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

When he was crucified Jesus uttered: 'It is finished.' What had finished? His earthly ministry during which he painted a picture of the most intimate communion between Himself, the Father, and the Holy Spirit, so intimate that the Church needed a new word: 'Tri-Unity' or 'Trinity' for short.

God is pulsating, shimmering light, dancing in threefold exchange of love, each being simultaneously poured into the other. God is 'Being-In-Love' and love is always relational.

'You are made in the image and likeness of God'? Because of the ministry of Jesus Christ, we know what that really means. We are made to live in relationship – not in solitary.

If we think that the ultimate good is to be self-sufficient/autonomous, that leads to a hellish existence. When we live with as much selfgiving as is possible, we are on the way to a heavenly existence.

We could pause for a moment to give thanks for the revelation of the nature of God, and consequently of the true nature of human beings.

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
