ARCHBISHOP CHRISTOPHER PROWSE 2023 CHRISTMAS MESSAGE LOVE ALWAYS TRIUMPHS



The birth of Jesus, the Light of the World, always triumphs over the darkness.

The hope and light of the First Christmas in the Gospels is proclaimed from the darkness of the night. There is a star that guides. There is the joyful light that the shepherds, the Magi, and all creation encounter in the humble stable. The surrounding "night" is not simply due to the fact of no sun. It is because there is no Son (of God) in the hearts of some. There are those who plot the killing of the Christ Child. Jesus himself is clothed in cloths and placed in a wooden crib - all suggesting a future death on Calvary. There is no hospitality for the "Prince of Peace" here. This pattern continues even today.

There is the continuing darkness of the wars in Ukraine, the Holy Land, Africa and other places. Let us not forget that war is always a defeat for humanity – here darkness is chosen over the light of love and peace-making. There is also the challenge in Australia of re-imagining our relationships with our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people after the defeat of the Voice Referendum.

Also, with the upward trend of the cost of living, this Christmas will be tough for so many to provide the necessities of table and shelter for their loved ones. Yet, in the midst of these many darknesses, dawns the triumph of Divine Love found in the birth of the Son of God - Jesus, love itself.

Let us in silence and adoration invite this Christmas light, that chases away the long darkness of loneliness and isolation, to triumph in our hearts, our families and our communities! Let Christmas joy have a practical expression in helping others. Ple ase give generously to the Archbishop's Christmas Appeal. It will assist greatly places of need throughout the world.

CHRISTMAS IS NEAR. With such joy, we celebrate the birth of a Child, a reminder that we are all children of a lavishly loving God who, in Jesus, chose to have no boundaries between divinity and humanity! Following Jesus, Mary MacKillop lived in a way that held no boundaries around her love for God and her love for humanity. Love is love is Love. When Mary MacKillop was visiting families of the children attending the Hall School in Adelaide, she noticed a number of poorly clad children playing in the streets. She invited them to come to the school, making sure that their parents understood that they did not have to pay. Sadly, they informed Mary that this was not possible as they had no suitable clothes. Mary took immediate action. She put an advertisement in the local Catholic paper asking for second-hand clothes to be delivered to the Hall so that she, the Sisters and the older students, could cut them down and then make them up for the street children. The response to her call was so successful that within six months, the enrolment in the Hall school had gone from around 60 to 200! People saw this indiscriminate, lavish squandering of time and energy, of encouragement and generosity; not looking for fault but for affirmation and new life! People saw and wondered, "What's going on here! Who is this woman?" Christmas is the feast of plenty! It is the celebration of Love that makes sure that rain falls on the scattered seeds of humanity no matter where they have fallen: on barren soil, among thorns, along hardened pathways or in lush, green pastures.

So, to the profoundly beautiful call of Christmas! Like Mary MacKillop, are we prepared to be as unjust as our God who makes rain to fall on the deserving and undeserving alike? As I go about my daily life and see someone who is struggling among the thorns of her anxieties or depression, can I drop a little rain? Or, one who is walking the path of ill health, can I drop a little rain? Or, one who is sitting on a rock of hard times. Can I share my little store of rain? Or, if I see someone enjoying good times, can I share in the joy and laughter and even dance with them? We, like Mary MacKillop, are called to join in this mad dancing in the lovingly unconditional rain! Blessed Advent! Happy Christmas!

First Reading Is 62:1-5

The Lord takes delight in you.

About Zion I will not be silent, about Jerusalem I will not grow weary. until her integrity shines out like the dawn and her salvation flames like a torch. The nations then will see your integrity, all the kings your glory, and you will be called by a new name. one which the mouth of the Lord will confer. You are to be a crown of splendour in the hand of the Lord.

a princely diadem in the hand of your God; no longer are you to be named 'Forsaken', nor your land 'Abandoned', but you shall be called 'My Delight' and your land 'The Wedded'; for the Lord takes delight in you and your land will have its wedding. Like a young man marrying a virgin, so will the one who built you wed you, and as the bridegroom rejoices in his bride, so will your God rejoice in you.

Second Reading Acts 13:16-17. 22-25

Paul spoke of Christ, the son of David.

When Paul reached Antioch in Pisidia, he stood up in the synagogue, held up a hand for silence and began to speak:

'Men of Israel, and fearers of God, listen! The God of our nation Israel chose our ancestors. and made our people great when they were living as foreigners in Egypt; then by divine power he led them out.

'Then he made David their king, of whom he approved in these words, "I have selected David son of Jesse, a man after my own heart, who will carry out my whole purpose". To keep his promise, God has raised up for Israel one of David's descendants, Jesus, as Saviour, whose coming was heralded by John when he proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the whole people of Israel. Before John ended his career he said, "I am not the one you imagine me to be; that one is coming after me and I am not fit to undo his sandal".'

Gospel Acclamation Mt 1:1-25

Alleluia. alleluia! Tomorrow the wickedness of the earth will be destroyed: the Saviour of the world will be our king. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 1:18-25

(or Longer Form Mt 1:1-25)

Mary will give brith to a son and you will name him Jesus.

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

The Virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord told him to do: he took his wife to his home and, though he had not had intercourse with her, she gave birth to a son; and he named him Jesus.

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Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

The glory of God and profound peace reaching out to embrace the whole of humanity are dynamically related in the baby in the manger. This is the song of the angels, and it is our privilege to join in that song at this Christmas Mass.

Every baby is a promise of a new future which fills one with hope. But this baby is unique. This Jewish boy baby is the body language of God. This baby is the sonburst of God entering our dark world. This baby shows us that God is not impossibly remote but, rather, God as intimately close vulnerable infant.

And this baby fulfils all the yearning of the human heart. We want to love to the utmost. We want to be loved to the utmost. This baby enables both because he is without any finite boundaries or restraints: He is in-finite love reaching out to us.

Can we grasp all this? Probably not. So, like the little lambs nuzzling up to the manger, we just follow some deep intuition which says: 'I must kneel in adoration, it is good to be here.' We could pause for a moment to pray for the resolve to do our bit to echo the angel's message: 'I bring you good news of great joy to be shared by all peoples.'

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
