Reflection on the Gospel

Appreciating the riches of today's Gospel passage aside from a Eucharist understanding, does require entering to some extent imaginatively into the symbolic world that it presupposes: God's provision of the manna to the Israelites in their Sinai wandering. (Ex 16) If the gift of the "bread from heaven" (the manna) showed God's care for his people in their desert wandering, how much more does the gift of the Bread from heaven in the person of the Son? The Galilean crowd's difficulties with Jesus' claims ultimately stem from too constricted an image of God, an inability to believe in a God who has loved the world so much as to rain down from heaven "the Bread of life" in this so intimately personal form.
