GOSPEL: A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad: he has gone from home, and left his servants in charge, each with his own task; and he has told the doorkeeper to stay awake. So stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow, dawn; if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep. And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake!'



Reflection on the Gospel by Fr Michael Tate - Timely Living and the End of History

Our Lord portrays himself as the Master who goes away on a journey. It is certain that he will return, even if no-one in his household knows exactly when. That is *our* situation. What do we do in anticipation?

Our Lord, the Master, indicates we have a choice. We can close our eyes and enter into the world of dreams where we create our own fantasy futures, or we can stay awake and alert to do what Our Lord wants us to do: 'He left his *servants* in charge, giving to each his work.'

You and me – his servants – have a particular role or work in and for this phase of human history. A deep down intuition, prompted by the Holy Spirit, indicates what this is. We must be true to this assignment.

We could take a moment to pray that, when the Lord returns, we may hear: 'Come, good and *faithful* servant, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world.'

Reader: That the hand of God will rest on those of our community who are sick, including Don Raper, Felicity McNamara, Rupert Ermert, Dennis Dempsey, Ann McDougall, Val Biggers, Celia Roach, Cilla Ryan, and Mark Sissian. (pause) In faith we pray: **All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Reader: That this community, enriched by the gifts of the spirit, will be compassionate and generous this Advent. (pause) In faith we pray: **All: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Reader: That those who have completed their earthly pilgrimage will have the promise of endless life, including Tom Richardson, Ida Feld (Priest's housekeeper in 60s), Frank Stephens, Peter Camiller, Hec Kain, all those who have died of the Corona virus, those recorded in our Book of Remembrance and our own deceased relatives and friends. (pause) In faith we pray: **All: Lord, hear our prayer.**
