"Can you drink the cup that I must drink?" The blithe confidence with which James and John agree exposes even further the nakedness of their ambition for messianic glory. That ambition blinds them to the darker significance of the word "cup" in the psalms and prophets. Along with joy, life, consolation and salvation, the word suggests judgement, suffering and affliction. All of these meanings are harvested and distilled in the communion cup of Christ's blood. To drink from this cup is to embrace all "the joys and hopes, the grief and anguish of the people of our time." Is it this bitter-sweetness that deters so many from partaking?
