Gospel Reflection: Will You Risk Being Unclean?

We see them every day – the "lepers".

They are ostracised at social gatherings; they live on the streets; they are in prison; they are lonely aged people. they are refugees. They often live "outside" the community.

They live the same fate as the lepers in Jesus' time. Scripture scholars say that the leprosy in the Gospel probably was different from the disease we call leprosy today. It was a skin condition more like psoriasis, which caused scaly, flaky skin. The worst part of the condition might have been the community's response. Ancient Judaism required lepers to live away from their families and village. They were isolated, kicked out. Jews went out of their way not to touch lepers because it made you unclean – which risked your ejection from the community as well.

But Jesus, moved with compassion, touched the leper and welcomed him back to the community, back to friends and family.

This week think about the "lepers" you pass – the people our society avoids and treats as unclean. They may be at your school, workplace, or walking from shelter to shelter in your town or living alone in an aged-care home. Ask for God's wisdom to know how you can bring them compassion and friendship. And be prepared for the people who treat you as if you are unclean for doing so.
