Parish Get Together on 23rd March. This will be a sausage sizzle after Mass, before the end of daylight saving. The parish will supply the sausages and parishioners are asked to bring some nibbles/slice (finger food) to share.

World Day of Prayer will be hosted by St Bede's this year. It will be on Thursday 7th March at 2.00pm. This movement is led by Christian women of many traditions and has been prepared by the women of Slovenia.

This year's theme is: "Come - everything is ready." The theme stems from Luke's gospel (14:15-24) in which he talks about the master inviting others to his feast. Following this theme we are focusing on strengthening communities, how to build a community, and who is invited into this community.

Christians of many faith traditions and backgrounds, used to worshipping in different styles, will come together to pray to our great God for the needs of Slovenia, and in so doing find that those needs often echo our needs and those of our neighbours at home.

Both women and men are invited to participate in this service. St Bede's will host afternoon tea afterwards. Please bring a plate to share.



Reflection:

The radical teaching that was begun in last week's gospel as the beatitudes and woes is continued in this week's challenge to be forgiving, compassionate and generous in the same way that God expresses abundant love. As with the blessings and curses of the Beatitudes passage, this teaching continues the challenge to act against cultural and social expectations. Who would be surprised if you were to express hatred for an enemy or for someone who hates you or treats you badly? But Jesus tells his disciples to love their enemies and to do good to those who hate them. His instruction is contrary to the 'normal' way of doing things – and that's exactly the message Jesus wanted to convey! Rather than a spiteful, vengeful God who keeps score and punishes wrongdoing, Jesus presents a compelling image of a God of unbounded compassion and abundant generosity. In this passage we find one version of the Golden Rule that appears repeatedly throughout the gospels (as well as most other religious traditions): 'Treat others as you would like them to treat you.' It is followed up with a comment that it takes no effort to treat well people whom you like – anybody can do that. The challenge is to treat people you don't like as you would like to be treated yourself. In a society that had very strict rules about the way to treat different people and clearly established boundaries between different groups, this was a tough ask by Jesus. Bear in mind also that there was an occupying army in the country and Jesus was encouraging the people to treat even their enemies, the Romans, with love, compassion and forgiveness.
