Concerning our weekend Mass times.

Peter at present is leading our Saturday Eucharist at 6pm, then at Bungendore at 8.30 am on Sunday and every second week celebrating the Eucharist in Canberra at noon.

In fairness to Peter, I believe that we should keep this arrangement.
