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DIOCESAN PASTORAL COUNCIL PARISH SUBMISSION

Archbishop Christopher has proposed a new Diocesan Pastoral Council (DPC) that will assist him in the core mission of the Church in this Archdiocese – a mission involving evangelising, service and promoting human flourishing in a fulfilled creation.

Parish bulletins of 25 September and 16 October 2022 invited views on this proposal. A submission put together by a group of Blackfriars Parish parishioners was made on 28 October.

The submission said that a DPC would be an avenue for the Holy Spirit to speak to the Archbishop through the charisms that the Spirit gifts to all the people of God. A DPC would help the Church to function better through an embracing of culture and structures of inclusion and co-responsibility. It would assist the Archdiocese reading the signs of the times, asking 'what is God asking of us today?' and proclaiming the Gospel. The submission supported the desire for a more open, listening and participative Church and said that the Cont...DPC should gather the different and especially less heard voices in the Archdiocese, and inform and work with the Archbishop to support, minister to and advocate for those voices and their communities' pastoral needs. And, in so doing, help to renew the Church.

Areas where the DPC could focus included discipleship and formation; bringing together the strengths of the clergy, religious and laity; development of an Archdiocesan Reconciliation Action Plan; building relationships across the Archdiocese as members of the body of Christ in prayer; and being a bridge between local faith communities and the national and global Church.

DPC membership should be diverse and the minimum female representation on the DPC should be at least 50% of the lay representation.

It was felt that greater attention should be given to ecumenism, building on very good ecumenical relationships that Pope Francis and our Archbishop already have. The submission pointed to examples of ecumenical collaboration between Blackfriars Parish, Holy Cross Anglican Church and St Margaret's Uniting Church in a number of areas including Alpha, *Laudato Si'* dialogue, moves to establish a Christian Economists Group, inter-church youth group, Lenten preparation and the annual combined churches Christmas Nativity Display and Carols.

SEIZE THE DAY

First Sunday of Advent. As the new liturgical year begins, Fr John Patrick Kenrick OP reminds us that this may be our last.

In Advent, as we prepare for the annual celebration of a past event - Christ's birth - we are also preparing for a future event - Christ's return in glory.

It is his unconditional love for each one of us that gives us the confidence to make every day of our lives a day to turn away from sin and back to the Lord, to allow the Holy Spirit to liberate us from that deadly indifference to God's will for us. And so in this season we reflect on those passages of scripture that renew our hope, our trust in the power of God to change us.

Our faith in God is often challenged by the sheer magnitude of human evil in the world which leaves us feeling quite helpless in the face of human greed and violence. The prophets of the Old Testament were made of sterner stuff and never lost sight of the advance of God's reign. Isaiah's words today ring out with a defiant message of hope. The Assyrian war machine was about to descend on Israel and Isaiah knew it. He also knew that the sins of those in power were inviting retribution. But he gives us a vision of a new world, the end of war and a time when all nations will acknowledge the True God and live 'in the light of the Lord'.

If the advent of God's reign is certain, there are no grounds for complacency. St Paul reminds us that the night of human history is almost over, 'the time' has come for us to make a final decisive break with all that is dark within us. If we truly long for God's reign our conversion to Christ cannot be half-hearted. We are too easily discouraged from tackling our sins. The season of Advent provides us with a concrete timetable for change and renewal. Like those stark health warnings on packets of cigarettes, the gospel today gives us a much needed jolt. The Lord will come like a thief Cont...in the night, when we least expect it. From one perspective, that has been the story of humanity all along. The fall of man in the garden of Eden reads like a bad dream. And people have been sleepwalking into sin ever since. But God has all along been shaking us awake. He came in the words of his prophets and he came most dramatically of all, in person, not occupying centre stage, but taking the role of a minor character. That first advent certainly changed everything; it brought God as close to us as our neighbour. From that moment on it has always seemed that we only have to reach out to touch God. From God's perspective, no doubt, it has always been an eternal advent - the divine Word has never stopped proceeding from the Father and accomplishing his task. So we talk about the second coming in Advent but really it is our own receptivity to God's coming which is the heart of the matter.

In every generation the Father finds his children 'asleep'. Some have given up on God, some have never even known him. And even those who do claim to believe in God are very easily distracted by the cares of this world. Advent is another opportunity for change; but we will fail to grasp it if we start thinking that Advent comes round every year. This may be our last Advent. It certainly will be for millions. God is giving us another chance to respond to his amazing love for us before death steals up on us and we slip away, scarcely noticed, into divine judgment.

A contrite heart and a renewed hope is the visitation from on high that we need now. So that, in the words of today's psalm, we can truly rejoice when we hear it said 'Let us go to God's house'. Fr John Patrick Kenrick OP
