



PLANNING

It's said that if you fail to plan, you plan to fail! Another similar expression is that "a lack of planning on your part does not justify an emergency on my part." I suspect that last one might have been first uttered by an exasperated parent. contending with the demands of rearing children. The trouble with planning is that you can become so focussed on the what, where, why, when, and how behind your goals and objectives that you can lose sight of what else could present itself. When Jesus showed up on the shore of Galilee, I have no doubt that those two fishermen were preoccupied with their nets and the day's catch. And yet when He called, something in His voice compelled them to drop everything. They responded, the Gospel tells us, "immediately." As Christians, we have to be ready, willing, and able to respond to God's call upon our lives. This is what the picture describes as 'the adventure of discipleship.' Being open to that call allows us to be flexible and to respond with enthusiasm, joy and hope. And it shows that we are willing to be part of a plan bigger plan than anything we could ever imagine. # WHEN JESUS CALLS, WE MUST RESPOND

"This week, Mark presented the call of the disciples, in the same way John presented the call last week. John saw evangelisation as a process of personal witness, personal invitation, and discipleship from friend to friend. Mark, however, placed the call to discipleship in the public arena; it was made directly by Jesus. John emphasised the role of the disciple recruiting others. Mark emphasised the relationship of Jesus to the disciple. "Mark began with the arrest of the Baptist to introduce Jesus to public ministry. Jesus picked up the Baptist's theme. The Kingdom of God is imminent. Repent. Unlike the Baptist, Jesus did not proclaim the advent of the Messiah. He preached belief in the Good News. Soon, the preaching of the gospel would eclipse the expectation for God's chosen One. [1:14-15] "The Good News demanded a response. It was more than a moral turnabout. It meant a new life situation, a new relationship with God. For Mark, Jesus was the embodiment of the Good News. His preaching, his call, established this new relationship with God. Notice Jesus called four men and all four responded immediately (Mark's transition word used in 1:18 and 1:20). Leaving their livelihood, they followed the preacher and presence of the Good News."

### TRUE TO GOD'S WORD

The First Reading poses a puzzle that has bedevilled philosophers and theologians.

God commands Jonah to tell the people of Ninevah these words: *Forty days more and Ninevah shall be destroyed*. Now, the people of Ninevah believed that God's words are true, and they repented. And God was pleased with them for believing his words and repenting. BUT—God's words seem to be false. At any rate, forty days after Jonah's telling the people God's words, the city is still standing. And so here is the puzzle: could God say words that are false, and could God be pleased with the people of Ninevah for believing a falsehood?

Philosophers and theologians have had a lot to say about this puzzle. But here is a simple thought. God's words are always true, and God is always true to his word. When God's words call you, God puts your life at a cross-road. You can ignore him and continue stubbornly with your old life, as if God didn't really matter, or didn't really care what you did, or maybe didn't really exist at all. Or you can open yourself to God. You can respond to him with a willingness to trust and obey. But if you do this, you will be leaving your old life behind for a new life that might well have been unimaginable to you beforehand. You won't be who you were before. You will be a new person, in God and for him. The people of Ninevah respond to God's call in this second way. They believe God's words and will to be obedient to God, and that is why they repent their former ways. As a result they become very different from the people they had been. The whole city becomes a very different city from the one it had been. There are, then, two ways in which the Lord's words to Ninevah can be true. Ninevah can be destroyed either because God demolishes the city or because the people cease to be the Ninevah that they were. Either way, the old Ninevah will no longer exist. Therefore, God's words to Ninevah were true. When the people of Ninevah responded to God's words with trust and obedience, they ceased to be what they were-and the old Ninevah was destroyed. God's words are always true, and God is always true to his word. **Eleonore Stump** 

#### CHOSEN TO WITNESS

Third Sunday of the Year. Fr Allan OP explains that the college of Apostles was chosen to pass on the truth of the Gospel. If you were interviewing prospective apostles what would you be looking for? Somebody who was loyal, honest, trustworthy? What about Peter in the courtyard of the High Priest's house? Would you look for somebody who knew their own limitations and did not overestimate their own strengths or abilities? What about Peter at the Last Supper, or trying to walk on the stormtossed waters of the Sea of Galilee? Would you look for a person who was not ambitious for their own advancement? What about James and John wanting to sit on either side of Jesus when he came into his kingdom? Would you look for people who were direct and straightforward and not devious in any way? James did not approach Jesus directly with his request for promotion, he got his mother to do it for him. The choice Jesus makes is not because of what the disciples are but of what they will become.

The twelve represent the twelve tribes of the new Israel. The old Israel had delegated just the priestly tribe of Aaron for the worship of God, the new people formed around the twelve is to be entirely priestly characterized by vocation and election, not by heredity. The twelve are the foundation stones of the new Church because they were eyewitnesses to the whole of Jesus' life from his baptism by John to his ascension. Chosen by Christ they are a special set of witnesses set apart not so much by what they see as by the fact that they are chosen to see. What they see comes to them as a gift, they are chosen to pass on this gift, to be part of the process of tradition, the process that can only go on within the group of witnesses.

The work of preaching is not a solitary task. It is not a function or a job which somebody can do simply because they have a talent for it, after all, many of the apostles do not seem to have had a special gift for it. An apostle receives a commission that comes directly from Christ through his Church. It is a mission that is always exercised in relation to others. The word itself means one who is sent. You cannot send yourself.

The Twelve were to offer a sort of group witness. St Mark tells us that when Jesus called Simon, Andrew, James and John from their nets by the sea of Galilee he called them together. They were partners in a small fishing co-operative, or a little business. This group was transformed by hearing the word of Jesus into a new kind of community. They are now put into the enterprise of being fishers of men. They will catch people with the net of the Gospel and bring them to Christ. The little group of fishermen is to become a college of preachers and ministers. The fullness of his gospel is to be handed on through the life and ministry of this college. The gospel was to be communicated not simply through what each of them said individually, but through what all of them were collectively. The preaching of the apostles is not like a simple black and white forensic photograph. When a crime is committed special forensic officers come and take pictures of the scene. They try to show it as it actually was at a particular time. They kind of freeze frame it. The preaching of the Gospel is not like that. It is more like an Impressionist painting. The Impressionists were intent on seizing reality and presenting it in a living way. They wanted to capture the fleeting dynamic of light without freezing it. It is the same with preaching the Gospel. The apostles all have their own take, their own vision of the life and ministry of Jesus. They are not learning a lesson that is to be repeated in a deadpan way. They are giving testimony, showing how God was at work in Jesus and how he is still at work through Jesus. Each is giving this in his different way. Just as in an Impressionist painting the dots and points made by the painter's brush capture the reality of what is being presented, so the twelve in their different testimonies show that Christ is alive and present with us now. They are not giving evidence as in a court of law about what did happen, they are testifying to what is happening now. http://english.op.org/torch
