FIRST READING

First reading - Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? ADOPTION AS CHILDREN OF GOD



A few years ago some friends of mine, who have been married for over eight years, realised for medical reasons they cannot have children. This saddened them, it was a very great cross, as I am sure it is for many who find themselves in this situation. Nevertheless, they ventured to adopt some children from South Korea.

This process was long and emotionally draining but finally they were be able to bring their children home. In this story we see the work of the Holy Spirit and our adoption too.

The Holy Spirit's work is to make us adopted children of God. It is by the spirit's power that as St Paul mentions in his epistle to the Romans we receive this adoption, he remarks:

¹⁵ the spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship.^(II) and by him we cry, "*Abba*, ^(II) Father." ¹⁶ the Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. ¹⁷

Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.

Just as the Holy Spirit facilitated God the Son's incarnation in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary and thus God the Son became Son of God and son of man, so too do we by virtue of our baptism now share in the same sonship. At baptism each of us received the Holy Spirit and that Spirit drew us into God's household.

It is to be remembered that we are not children of god by nature, only one is a child of God by nature - God the Son who became enfleshed and became man for us - Jesus Christ. We on the other hand are adopted children of God by the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Spirit adopted us at baptism so that we might share in the inheritance Christ won for us in his death and resurrection. Just as Jesus rose from death, so too the prize he won is associated with us as we are his co-heirs being children of the same Father. Yet our sonship whilst being adoptive is no less real, no less important, not some kind of second class sonship. In reality this sonship we receive through the Holy Spirit is spontaneous, free and loving. Couples, like my friends, adopt because they lack children of their own... but God the Father finds infinite pleasure and delight in his only begotten Son. He possesses a Son so lovable...so loving that the result of this mutual love...is personal love-the Holy Spirit, and yet God the Father still chooses us.

In order that the inexhaustible love between the Father and the Son might come to us, God willed to communicate that same Spirit of love to us as a pledge of our true adoption so that we may enjoy not only the fruits of the resurrection but the very life of God himself.

A French Dominican of the 19th century Jacques-Marie-Louis Monsabre put it like this. "all the tenderness of the human heart is impotent to transform the nature of an Cont....adopted son who, to his credit or discredit, preserves in his veins the blood of his [biological parents]. Nothing can be changed through adoption; the most that can be granted to the adopted son is a title with its accompanying rights. But God goes beyond that. He works in the very core of our substance and he re-engenders us supernaturally, communicating his own nature to us...we are called his children because we are truly that: we have been named and so we are. For as St Augustine says if we are made children of God we are made Gods too."

The fallout of the Holy Spirit's work is to draw us to the household of God to be his children and by being children heirs to the wealth which is the divine life. Each of us as children of the Father are called to this inheritance, to drink at the wellspring of divinity and to thus become partakers of the divine nature.

LIVING AS ONE IS POSSIBLE

The following is an extract from a homily by Fr Richard Conrad OP:

'Pentecost is the result of Good Friday and Easter; it makes visible, audible, on the public stage, what was achieved 50 days earlier.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost celebrated the harvest and the gift of the Law. For us it celebrates the gathering in of the harvest Jesus produced by dying, and the gift of the New Law...

Further, in today's Gospel we hear that the Spirit enables us to forgive sins, to be a community of reconciliation -though we also hear a warning: if we fail to forgive, we get in the way of the forgiveness of which we should be channels.

In the Spirit's power, we live as one -- and we go out as heralds of the truth, as ministers of forgiveness. "As the Father has sent me, even so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit." At Pentecost, the Sprit began to impel the Church on her universal mission." <u>http://torch.op.org</u>

WHY DO WE CELEBRATE PENTECOST?

There are three "mega-festivals" commemorated in the Christian calendar. The first two, Christmas and Easter, are well known to both believers and non-believers. But it's possible that even liturgical Christians may not be as familiar with the third, the festival of Pentecost. God the Father's wonderful Christmas gift of His one and only Son, and Christ's Easter triumph over the power of sin, death, and the devil would be of no benefit to us if the Holy Spirit did not give us the gift of saving faith. This precious gift of faith in the saving work of our Lord Jesus Christ is the reason Pentecost is the third "mega-festival" of the church and why we celebrate it with such joy and thanksgiving.
