#### Second reading - Romans 8:18-23


A reading from the letter to St Paul to the Romans

#### GOSPEL

#### Gospel - Matthew 13:1-23

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such large crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.



He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied, 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled: You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive.

For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me.

'But happy are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy men longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it.

'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in his heart: this is the man who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the man who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But he has no root in him, he does not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and he falls away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the man who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so he produces nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the man who hears the word and understands it; he is the one who yields a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'

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#### THE SEED OF EVANGELISATION



Over the last couple of years, we have heard the word evangelisation appear within the Church's lexicon. When we think of evangelisation we might cast our minds back to the heroes of the Christian faith, St Paul, for instance planting and developing churches throughout Asia Minor in the first

century. Later the great St Francis Xavier, left the comfort of Europe to spread the gospel in India and South East Asia. Even just over one hundred years ago the Frenchman Peter Chanel evangelised in the South Pacific, eventually giving his life up for the cause of the gospel.

The mission of evangelising then has usually fallen upon the shoulders of clergy or religious, but this situation has changed. With far less men and women giving of themselves to the religious life and priesthood the work of evangelisation needs to be continued by the lay faithful if indeed we feel that the Christian story needs to be re-told.

The story of the Sower in our gospel then relates how we can evangelise. The sower seems to be fairly carefree when it comes to sowing his seed, some of it is thrown on the concrete path, some of it ends up in the bushes, some in thorns, some on rocky ground, whilst some of it does end up where it should, on fruitful ground.

This metaphor for evangelisation then calls for us to be carefree with our spread of the gospel. Yet, first of all we need to understand what we mean by the gospel and our following of Christ. Perhaps in the week ahead you could even write down what makes you a Christian and what you would want people to know about that. If we're not convinced of our faith how can we expect others to be attracted to it? Second, we need to break the mindset that our faith is something that is personal to us. Sadly, in our Australian culture religion seems to be a private affair and sometimes we may even fear being "found out" as a Christian. How can we make Christ known if we keep him to ourselves?

Today then let's ask Jesus for the grace to be like the sower, carefree in casting wide the seed of the gospel, so that our return may be "hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty."

#### **GENEROSITY**

The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for the one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me' (Matt 25:40). #### **FUTURE PARISH ARRANGEMENTS**

At a meeting of representatives of the five inner north Parishes (Watson, O'Connor, Campbell, Braddon, Dickson) on 6 July the Vicar General, Fr. Richard Thompson, confirmed that it will be a few weeks before arrangements are finalised about who will succeed Fr Mannes as parish priest when the Dominican Fathers withdraw from the parish at the start of Advent. He reiterated clearly, however, that the Archbishop wishes to minimise uncertainty for parishioners as far as possible and that the parish will remain open going forward, with Mass celebrated here.

The question at the heart of our prayerful discernment during the meeting was "What is <u>God's will</u> for our <u>evangelising communities</u> for the inner north?". It became evident that each parish has a rich history and identity worth preserving and that there is a strong desire to support hopeful, faith-filled communities to remain sources of evangelisation and witnesses to Christ. However, each parish also faces the very real challenges of declining finances, worship attendance, family and youth communities, volunteer resources for administration and grounds maintenance, and finite and stretched clergy to administer the sacraments.

Although it is intended to preserve parish communities as much as possible, discussions are beginning about the possibilities of introducing shared resourcing arrangements for parish administration in the future. With fewer priests, further consolidation of mass times is likely to be required over time. The Archdiocese is working to source additional clergy, beginning with the expected commencement of three Blessed Sacrament Fathers, who will most likely live in community at O'Connor. More detailed advice about our situation at Holy Rosary will be provided as soon as possible.

#### WHICH LISTENING GROUP DO YOU FALL INTO?

religious people who thought they had no need to listen to Jesus, because they already had the truth, and were not going to allow him or any prophet to change their minds, especially if it meant changing their privileged status... we do not have to be pessimistic about ourselves; we have all of the failings which are represented by the hard surface, the dusty surface and the cluttered surface, but we can have hope, because God who chooses to use us, is the miracle worker who even in our hearts' poor soil can bring forth more good than we could ever have imagined.'
