

Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped. The men in the boat bowed down before him and said, 'Truly, you are the Son of God.'

RECOGNISING GOD



Where is God? I was asked this question by a little boy a couple of week's ago. A difficult question to answer. Children of a certain age tend to be very concrete with their thinking, to suggest to the boy God is everywhere and that God is a spirit, immaterial, may not have

cut the mustard with him.

And yet as we mature and deepen in our faith, God is seen everywhere: in the complexity of creation, in the smile of a child, in the wise face of a more senior person. It is, as it were, that God hides behind all these various facets of our human experience. What these experiences do is lead us to the transcendent, the great beyond.

Our readings this weekend focus us on recognising God. Elijah in our Old Testament reading has just escaped the revenge of Queen Jezebel for killing her prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. The prophet now is on the run, hiding from her troops who are pursuing him. In this moment of fear and anxiety Elijah experiences a variety of events which supposedly reflect the glory of God; a mighty wind blows past breaking rocks, a great earthquake manifests itself, followed by a devouring fire. Yet, in all these terrifying manifestations God is not present. It is only in the still breeze that Elijah realises God's presence. This narrative evokes for us a clue about our prayer life, that God is not met through great chatter and carry-on, but in silence.

Likewise follows the theme of recognition. In this instance Paul laments the future of Israel. His concern is that how could Israel, which had been prepared by God over many centuries to expect a Messiah, fail to recognise him in Christ. This rationale holds for us too, do we get bogged down in the complexities of our faith, and yet fail to recognise Christ?

Lastly, the gospel sees Peter attempt to walk on water at Jesus' behest. Peter fails because he still doesn't recognise Jesus' divine power. Peter wants to go it alone thinking he can make it but in reality he needs Jesus to achieve what is seemingly impossible. The gospel teaches us then that we can go it alone but at our own expense, rather we need to recognise that Christ is always there to guide us even when do not see it.

Fundamentally our recognition of God in our lives is an act of faith. It can be summed up in the words of a Carthusian monk who wrote:

"A soul who sees nothing but darkness but says to God: My God, I see nothing; but because you tell me that this darkness is your light, I believe it. Everything in me tells me the contrary, but I give up this 'me' and listen to you rather than to it. I choose you—not it: such a soul puts God in his true place-first."

To recognise God then in our lives is a practice in reducing our ego and let God take his rightful place in our lives. In this Eucharist let us pray to decrease and for God to increase.
