A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. HE went in and said to her: 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her: 'Mary, to not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the house of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel: 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' The Holy Spirit will come upon you,' the angel answered, 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary, 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

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#### **ROSARY SUNDAY**



In an age which actually craves spiritual Experiences, the recitation of the Rosary can truly offer a simple way of attaining a spiritual dimension to one's life.

In order for us to become more Christlike we have to walk with Christ on his Mission in the world. What the Rosary does is to launch us into the very lives of

Jesus and Mary so that they may become more truly a part of our lives and we a part of theirs.

The key to the Rosary then is to meditate on the mysteries provided to us by holy tradition. It is in these mysteries that we can experience the life of Christ and the Blessed Mother. Yet, the allegation is often raised at how repetitive the Rosary is, particularly in the use of the Hail Mary. The device of the Hail Mary's is twofold, however. First, it is simply a tool, much like a mantra, we can say it and it more or less becomes the rhythm behind the actual work of meditating on the mysteries at hand. Nevertheless, there is a second reason the Church employs it and that is as an act of love for the Blessed Mother.

How often do we tell people we love them? How often do you husbands remind your wives of your love of them, and vice versa? How often do you children tell your parents that you love them? To say those words means something, something deeper than what those words can possibly convey. Similarly when we pray each Hail Mary we offer our esteem and devotion to this great woman who loves us in return, wants us to be holy and pure like her, and wants us to be true and loyal subjects of her Son. We should never be afraid of loving Our Lady too much for as St Maximilian Kolbe, that hero of Auschwitz once remarked, "You can never love her more than Jesus did." In fact we honour people more when we honour their parents, and it is the same in the supernatural order, to honour Mary is to honour Christ and therefore God. It was the will of the Father to send his Son into the world through this woman. Therefore Our Lady is intimately involved in the work of salvation, the work of bringing all people to God's kingdom. Finally it is the Blessed Virgin herself who prophesied this honouring of her would happen when she prayed in her Magnificat:

My soul glórifies the Lórd, my spirit rejóices in Gód, my Sáviour. He looks on his sérvant in her lówliness; henceforth all áges will cáll me bléssed.

Today as we remember the aift of the Rosary as a tool of spiritual support, an instrument that gives us that spiritual experience, let us nor forget it's true object. The object of this sacred device is to fashion within us a solid interior life of prayer. By the meditation on the great mysteries of Our Lord's and Our Lady's life, we witness with them the very seminal events of our own salvation—drawing from those same episodes the very virtues and gifts we need for our Christian life. Combined with this noble venture we also recall the devotion, esteem, and love we have for Our Lady; each Hail Mary really acting as an 'I love you' to this remarkable woman, God's chosen vessel which brought forth the true light of the world, Christ Our Lord. So let us once more take up that chain that links us to heaven and let us with deeper devotion commit ourselves to a devout remembrance of the sacred mysteries and the love of our Mother who earnestly desires us to come home.
