GOSPEL

Gospel - Matthew 22:1-14

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with quests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'

YOU'RE INVITED....



Jesus, knowing the hardness of heart of his interlocutors today, tries yet another parable on his unbelieving audience.

The Parable of the Wedding Feast is once more addressed to the Chief Priests and elders. This group of people

knew of the prophecy of Isaiah which we've read already today. The messianic banquet "for all peoples" of Isaiah is what Jesus is intimating in his parable today.

First, Jesus recounts salvation history. The king's messengers are the prophets, and so Jesus reminds his Jewish friends of the following:

He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them.

In the history of the Jewish people there was a constant failure to listen to the prophets, the Jewish people being too distracted by the things of this world. The prophets' call to fidelity to God's Covenant was seen by the Jews as an interruption in their lives and these annoying utterances culminated in the maltreatment of the prophets and attempts to kill those messengers of God.

The invitation to the people on the crossroads and towns is a metaphor for the preaching of the gospel to the world. It is the gentiles to whom God will turn, as he revealed in the prophecy of Isaiah. Through this new call to the banquet of heaven all people, not just the "chosen people" are invited to the banquet at the end of time. This is done by Jesus' own band of apostles; God's new messengers.

Yet, even the gentile reception of the invitation is not all what it is made out to be.

This situation is borne out in the unfortunate man who is found to be without the wedding garment. The idea here is that even if one responds to the call of the gospel, one must be ready to be challenged by the invitation to become better, the wedding garment being a symbol of righteous deeds accompanying faith (Rev 19:7-8) (Mt 6:16-18), the condition for entering God's kingdom.

As we ponder who enters the kingdom of God let us reflect on how we respond to the invitation in our Christian life. Are we changed and challenged by the gospel, or will we, like the Jews of old, put worldly issues and cares ahead of God's call to join in the feast? Do we ignore the prophetic teaching of the Church and tend towards our own views and ideas about what is necessary for salvation? Cont.... Let us today pray for docility to the Holy Spirit who teaches us how to respond to the wedding feast invitation sincerely, faithfully and courageously.
