

But it is not as if you live in the dark, my brothers, for that Day to overtake you like a thief. No, you are all sons of light and sons of the day: we do not belong to the night or to darkness, so we should not go on sleeping, as everyone else does, but stay wide awake and sober.

GOSPEL

Gospel - Matthew 25:14-30

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of Heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out.

'The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money.

'Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made."

'His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness."

'Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness."

'Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."'

SUFFICIENT GRACE



Once again Jesus tells a parable about God's kingdom. This time the focus is utilising the graces that are given to us in this life.

Much like last week's gospel the concepts of lukewarmness and apathy, as evidenced in the pusillanimous servant

entrusted with one talent, are contrasted with the readly acceptance of grace as illustrated in the first two servants.

God's grace is that supernatural hand up which enables our feeble human nature to attain its true destiny. Humanity, you see, was made to enjoy the life of God, but the wounded human nature which was first encountered by Adam's sin and thus passed on to his posterity saw that primordial grace lost. Only in the coming of Christ and the merits of his death and resurrection, saw this supernatural aid once more enter into the human story.

Grace is given as God wills it, It is understood in the Church's teachings that we all receive sufficient grace to attain heaven. Yet, grace is resistible. We can say no to God's help to get to heaven and this rejection of grace manifests itself in the selfishness of sin. Mortal sin particularly cuts us off from the life of grace, our spiritual life dies, the lights of our souls are turned off and we exist, as it were, off the spiritual grid. Grace can be restored by sacramental confession, and further augmented by the sacrament of the Eucharist, by our attendance at Holy Mass, and by our regular prayer life.

The parable of the servants and their talents remind us not to squander the graces we receive. These graces can come to us in a variety of ways, for instance it may be the opportunity to say more prayers, attend a Mass during the week, or perform some corporal or spiritual work of mercy. In short we must be attentive to those moments where we can tap into God's loving relationship with us. Yet, either we respond to God's grace and let it change us and further us in the life of holiness, or, we can reject it by burying it in the ground and forgetting about it. If we indeed reject grace by burying it or not using the graces we receive then we risk the following rebuke from Christ at our particular judgment after death:

> "You wicked and lazy servant! throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."
