Pope Francis – On the Call to Holiness

Remember that the call to holiness we're exploring here is also and at the same time a call to build the Reign (Kingdom) of God. The two are inseparable. You will experience great happiness in your life when you learn the art of self-giving love and give yourself to this mission, body and soul. In a sense, we're each called to become a 'contemplative' in the midst of a busy life of service and love. Being a contemplative doesn't mean withdrawing to a quiet place and never coming back. It means, rather, loving silence while interacting with others; finding peace and quiet while working hard for justice; seeking prayer while serving your family, community, or the Church.

Engagement with the world is not 'second best' to prayer and contemplation. They go hand in hand. The pathway to interior peace and holiness is the same as the pathway to building up the Reign (Kingdom) of God. It isn't so much that we have accepted an arbitrary call to mission as that our very lives, oriented to God and flowing from the Spirit, are a mission.
