

St Mary of the Cross MacKillop

Born on 15th January 1842, in Fitzroy, Melbourne. Child of Scotish immigrants, Flora and Alexander Mac Killop. Flora was a Mac Donald, some of her relations settling in Nimmitabel.

At age twelve, Mary had to go to work to support her struggling family. At fifteen years of age she took up a governess (Teaching) position near Warnambool, Victoria. Mary met Fr Julian Tenison Woods and between them they heard a calling from God to provide education for poor rural children. On 19th March 1866, Feast of St Joseph, Mary literally founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. God truly blessed this work and, after many difficulties, the Sisters became a great gift for the Church in Australia and for the children in rural areas.

Today, the Sisters work in Peru, South America, Timor Leste, New Zealand as well in all states and territories of Australia.

Mary was beatified in 1995 and canonised a saint in 2010.
