

Lent – a time to ponder how we pray and why

On Prayer – St John Chrysostom 347-407 AD

Prayer is the light of the soul, giving us true knowledge of God. It is a link mediating between God and humanity. By prayer the soul is borne up to heaven and in a marvellous way embraces the Lord. This meeting is like that of an infant crying on its mother, and seeking the best of milk. The soul longs for its own needs and what it receives is better than anything to be seen in the world.

Prayer is a precious way of communicating with God, it gladdens the soul and gives repose to its affections. You should not think of prayer as being a matter of words. It is a desire for God, an indescribable devotion, not of human origin, but the gift of God's grace. As St paul says: we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. Anyone who receives from the Lord the gift of this type of prayer possesses a richness that is not to be taken from them.

Lent – a time to reflect on sin and its effects in our lives and in our world

"We beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God." (St Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, 5:20). And is it not the case that our need to be reconciled with God – the silent, mysterious, seemingly absent, and yet omnipresent God – is the real problem of the whole of world history.
