First Reading Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

Second Reading Rv 21:10-14, 22-23

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.

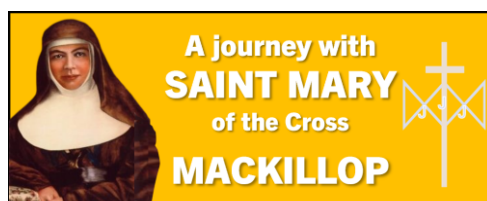


PRAYER INTENTIONS

Priest: Jesus remained in the love of God by obeying his commandments. He has reminded us of the correlation between love and obedience. Recognising our incapacity and weakness to live by the teachings of the Lord, let us now place before him all our petitions, saying,

1. For the Pope, bishops, clergy and religious that they may grasp the true meaning of Jesus' teachings on love and obedience and strive to make it a reality in their personal lives, Lord hear us.

2. For the leaders in civil and religious domains that they may understand the nature of their responsibility and sort out the difficulties they encounter with the supernatural light that comes from God, Lord hear us.

3. For all of us that we may understand that obedience is a sign of humility and love, and in humble and respectful obedience to God, we enter into a relationship which is mutually enriching, Lord hear us.

4. For all of us, that we may understand that peace is not absence of problems but resolving differences in the spirit of the gospel under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Lord hear us.

5. That all of us gathered here may experience the abiding presence of God in our lives and that experience may help us to be agents of peace, harmony and good relationship, Lord hear us.

6. For the children who are preparing for confirmation, that fill their hearts with joy, their minds with understanding, and their spirit with courage. May they grow strong in faith and love, Lord hear us.

7. We pray for the recently deceased from our parish and for those whose anniversary of death occurs around this time, may they be granted eternal life in Christ, Lord hear us.

8. For our own intentions we pray to our Blessed Mother Hail Mary.....

Priest: Thank you, Lord, for the gift of your Son who remained in perfect union with you by doing your will. Help us Lord to discern your will and live in total obedience to your commandments. We make this prayer through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

"You're a schoolteacher, huh?" he said. "Ma'am, today I shall realise my lifelong ambition. I've waited years to have a schoolteacher in this court. Sit down at the table and write 'I will not go through a red light' 500 times, and then I will dismiss your case!"



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Some people have the idea that God is awfully remote, dwelling beyond the edge of the cosmos. We make contact by sending a prayer like a long range rocket, hoping it will find its target.

This is far distant from Our Lord's teaching in today's Gospel.

'If anyone loves me and keeps my word, my Father and I *will make our home* with that person.' It is not in *outer* space, but in *inner* space that Divine Love will make a home.

What turns a house into a home? It is in sitting around a table sharing a meal. So, Jesus created a sacred meal for us and invites us to share in the Heavenly Bread and Spiritual Drink.

When we do so, we find, in the words of St John Paul II, that we 'digest, as it were, the secret of the Resurrection'. We take into ourselves the Real Presence of the Risen Lord who makes his home with us.

Coming to Communion, even after a long time away, satisfies the yearning of the human heart because it is made to be the habitation of Divine Love. We could pause for a moment to reflect on the gracious fact that God chooses to dwell in our hearts. Let us respond wholeheartedly.

The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you.

Jesus said to his disciples:
