they shall be called sons of God.



There is a consistency between the Old Testament reading and the Gospel of today

still had a long way to go. Paul was convinced

that there is no place for competition or envy.

He had already used the example of Jesus'

misplaced in the Christian community since

Jesus displayed his power in humble service.

He now goes one step further reminding the

Corinthians that their own humble origin is

a sign that God's call is best received with

But they will be able to graze and rest with no one to disturb them.


