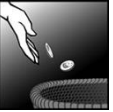

Reflection – Week 32 Ordinary Time

Every Jewish male was required to pay an annual half shekel, (1 day's pay for unskilled Labourer), offering towards the costs of the Temple (see Mt 17:24). Women were not obligated to make this offering. The offering of the widow was not required but freely given.



- The Jerusalem Temple was a massive structure with a large cohort of priests and attendants and its upkeep must have been a very expensive exercise.
- The treasury was a part of the Temple in Jerusalem and its function was under the exclusive control of the Sadducees, an elite and wealthy group of families of high priestly caste.

Shekel= 4d, 1 day pay = 1d, 1/2 shebel = 2d

This gospel refers to the Temple treasury. Jesus is not critical of the collection of funds per se; he reserves his scorn for those who exploit the poor and those who are less than generous. The collection of funds and the support of those in need has always been a part of the tradition of the Church. The letters of Paul, the earliest of the Christian writings, often refer to collections made on behalf of some Christian communities which were struggling. In the Acts of the Apostles the sharing of material goods so that none went without was part of the normal life of the first Christians. The giving of money to support the Church and its works is still a part of the life of every parish. Caritas Australia is the official aid and development agency of the Church in Australia. During Lent, Caritas runs Project Compassion, which collects funds to be used in other parts of the world to assist in authentic human development for people who have little. Each parish relies on contributions from the congregation for the upkeep and running of parish programs and buildings.
