Matthew's community must have been deeply troubled by the fact that the 'learned and clever' religious leaders of the day did not accept the message of Jesus. Surely they, of all people, should have been in a position to

recognise the truth.

Jesus' intimate address of Abba (Father) is used five times. This intimate relationship is characterised by God's entrusting all things to the Son, and the Son in turn revealing them to

those who have faith. Jesus is the perfect teacher, describing himself as gentle and humble in heart.

There is an interesting contrast here between the burden of following the restrictive laws of the Pharisees and the 'easy burden' of faith in Christ. The rules and laws of the Pharisees often added to the burden experienced by people of the day,

while Jesus tried to lift the burden from people.

DID YOU KNOW?

• The prayer of blessing which Jesus makes in this gospel is known as a berakah. It is the basis of Jewish prayers of praise and thanksgiving. In our liturgy we use the berakah form just before the Eucharistic Prayer: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this

bread and wine to offer to which we all respond: Blessed be God forever.

The word humility comes from the Latin for 'soil'. Humility is not about being shy or quiet or taking a back-seat; it is about recognising our origins and not becoming so 'learned and clever' that we get too big for our boots.

To be like 'mere children' is to have that sense of wonder and awe at things bigger than ourselves.

What are the experiences which produce a response of awe in you?
