Reflection 7 Sunday

Exploring The Word

In last week's gospel, the
disciples learned that to be a
faithful follower of Jesus,
they must be committed to a new order.



This week's text tells them how they must live
in that new order; in a sense it provides the
practical details. What Jesus is suggesting
should not be confused with passivity or simply
inaction or resignation in the face of
persecution and injustice. Quite the contrary!
What Jesus is suggesting is radical action. It
demands that we act towards others without
being asked, that believers offer friendship and
pardon constantly, without asking or hoping for
anything in return. In Jesus is located God's
self-revelation, God's actions in and for the
world, his plan for salvation and its fulfilment.
Followers of Jesus must act in these ways
precisely because they are the ways of God.

Turn the other cheek; love your enemies; do
good to those who hurt you! Why should we?
How can we? How challenging do you find this
directive?

Did You Know?

This gospel contains the most challenging of all
the Christian commandments and probably the
most difficult to keep: love your enemies and
do good to those who hurt you.

Making Connections.

Respond in a practical way to one of the
commands of Jesus in this gospel—for
example, pray for those who treat you badly;
be compassionate to someone, or forgive
someone who has wronged you.

*Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who
trespass against us.*
