Coming together as God's People

Each Sunday we meet Jesus in two ways. First he comes to us through the Word of God, the Bible, and then he comes to us through the Bread and Wine.

Jesus' friends listened to his stories when they sat at table with him, so do we.

In the ***Liturgy of the Word***, the First Reading is usually from the Jewish story of God (remember Jesus was a Jewish man). The Psalms are ancient sung prayers. The Second Reading is usually from the early letters written to Christians with give advice to grow more like Jesus. The Gospel has words and stories of Jesus.

The Creed says what Christians believe, and reminds us of our Baptism:

Children of God the FATHER

Who are able to grow more like JESUS the SON

Through the power of the HOLY SPIRIT

Who lives in us

And that we are members of the Christian family

Which is the CHURCH.

The Prayers that follow are for the Church, the world, for those who govern us, for our special needs and times. We pray for all who need our prayers.

The Offertory brings to the altar what we have, bread and wine, given to us by God. We believe that God will take this small offering and let it become the special bread and wine that brings us closer to Jesus and to one another.

The ***Eucharistic Prayer*** thanks God's goodness to us from the beginning of the world. We remember the last supper Jesus shared with his friends. We ask God to let this bread and wine become for us the body and blood of Christ. The Bread gives us strength to grow. The Wine is like his life flowing through us.

Through ***Holy Communion*** we grow to be more like Jesus, letting his life flow in us.

The ***Our Father*** is our family prayer; we belong to one another because we call God "Father". We pray for the coming of God's kingdom and for the strength to build that kingdom. The ***Sign of Peace*** says we come to God together and brings rings us closer to one another.

The ***Final Blessing*** sends us out to live with and for Jesus in our daily lives. .
