Reflection: Easter Sunday

The Easter Triduum (which
means 'three days'), lasting from
Holy Thursday evening to Easter
Sunday evening, is the climax of
the Church's year.



- Holy Thursday is sometimes known as
Maundy Thursday, a corruption of the Latin
word for commandment, *mandatum*. This is
to commemorate the 'new commandment'
that Jesus gave his followers at the Last
Supper: Love one another as I have loved
you.

- The stories of the Passion, Death and
Resurrection of Jesus were the earliest
stories told and later recorded by the early
Church. The commemoration of the events
of the Triduum is the earliest of Church
celebrations when the first Christians
gathered to break bread together.

- The women come to the tomb to anoint
the body of Jesus early on Sunday morning
because it is the first chance they have to
do so. The Jewish Sabbath begins at sunset
on Friday and ends at sunset on Saturday.
During this time no 'work' can be done so
the women must wait until dawn on the first
day of the week.
