Reflection: 11 Sunday Ordinary Time



The nearness of the
kingdom (or reign) of
God is the central plank
of the teaching of Jesus
in Mark's Gospel.

In the Old Testament, the imagery of the
reign of God had an apocalyptic
dimension; it was to come to fullness at
the end times when the wicked would be
punished and the faithful vindicated. Only
then would there be a new heaven and a
new Earth. The message in Mark's Gospel
however, is quite different. Jesus
proclaims that the kingdom of God has
already begun. It is among us now. 'This
is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of
God is at hand' (Mk 1:15).
Like the seed planted, it takes root and
grows mysteriously into something much
larger than itself. The kingdom or reign is
a gracious gift from God brought near in
Christ and demanding a response of faith
from those who recognise the truth of his
word. The kingdom offers a challenge;
like the man who sowed the seed, we
must be ready to cooperate in God's work
when the harvest time comes.

The mystery of the kingdom of God is at
the heart of this reading. Humans cannot
understand how it will grow and spread,
but, once planted, it will prosper as the
seed does, taking root and growing to
fullness. What begins as a tiny seed like
the mustard seed, will grow into
something much larger and offer shelter
for all.
