From the Goulburn Conference of **St Vincent de Paul.**

Enquiries from those interested in the work of the
Society are most welcome. Further information
can be obtained from President Pat Smith
(48221852.) For the three months of June, July
and August the local Conference was able to help
370 adults and 271 children. Forms of assistance
included 228 food packages, 19 clothing items
and assistance with electricity or gas to 90
households facing financial stress. Other
categories of assistance included payment for
chemist scripts, the provision of blankets and
bedding and contributions towards travel costs for
medical appointments. In each of these
categories, 10 to 20 people received help.
This assistance, with a value estimated to be in
the vicinity of \$7200, is made possible by the
efforts of a small number of volunteers. More
volunteers will ensure that the present level of
"good works" can be maintained.

Reflection Week 24 Ord. Time

Mark's Gospel contains many instructions on
what it means to be a
disciple. Ironically, it is
often the twelve who fail
the test of discipleship
while many of the minor
characters in Mark



provide wonderful models
of true understanding. In this text, we have one
example of Peter's imperfect understanding of
the mission and ministry of Jesus. The question
as to who Jesus is leads to one of the great
acclamations of faith in the gospels: 'You are
the Christ'. Peter knows that Jesus is the
Messiah, the one who is to come. What he fails
to understand is the type of Messiah that Jesus
is. Peter refuses to accept that Jesus will suffer
rejection and be put to death. He cannot
comprehend of such an end! Peter may well
have wanted the Davidic Messiah who would
liberate Israel from Roman occupation. He is
thinking in the ways of man not the ways of
God. He is an obstacle in the path that Jesus
knows he must follow. His will be a Messiahship
of service, of suffering and of self-giving love.
There is no triumph apart from the cross. To be
a disciple is to walk this same path of service,
suffering and self-giving love.

*What cross are you being called to take up at
this point? What do you need to leave behind?*

*What 'crosses' have you had to bear in your
life? Where did you find the strength to carry
your burden? Who are the people who have
helped you to bear your load? What positive
consequences came from the suffering you
bore? Share your reflections together.*
