From the Goulburn Conference of St Vincent de Paul.

Enquiries from those interested in the work of the
Society are most welcome. Further information
can be obtained from President Pat Smith
(48221852.) For the three months of June, July
and August the local Conference was able to help
370 adults and 271 children. Forms of assistance
included 228 food packages, 19 clothing items
and assistance with electricity or gas to 90
households facing financial stress. Other
categories of assistance included payment for
chemist scripts, the provision of blankets and
bedding and contributions towards travel costs for
medical appointments.

This assistance, with a value estimated to be in
the vicinity of \$7200, is made possible by the
efforts of a small number of volunteers. More
volunteers will ensure that the present level of
“good works” can be maintained.

Reflection: Week 25 Ord. Time DID YOU KNOW?

Capernaum was a town on the northern
shore of the Sea of Galilee. It was the home
town of Peter and some of the other
apostles. Jesus used Capernaum as his
‘home base’ during his ministry in the
region of Galilee. The ‘house’ referred to in
this text may well have been the house of
Simon Peter, where we know Jesus spent
time (Mk 1:29).

‘The Son of Man’ is a title Jesus often uses
of himself in Mark’s Gospel.

In sitting down to instruct the disciples
about being of service to others, Jesus is
reinforcing his words about being the least.
At that time, a teacher had greater status
than his students. The normal practice was
for students to sit at the feet of the teacher,
not the other way around.

In the ancient world, children had no status
at all but Jesus puts a child before them
and embraces him in welcome. This is
another gesture of reversal.

MAKING A CONNECTION!

Are there times when we expect God to
conform to what we want?

is, open and trusting, in your faith?
