A message from Fr James

Do Not be Afraid: There's Hope!

Dear Friends in Christ

The world is broiled in different adversaries. A cursory look, as Christians, evokes a feeling of End-time cataclysmic Armageddon-predictions. The pit of hell has opened its mouth and cast outrageous evil spells on Mother Earth to counteract Pope Francis' invitation in *Laudate Si* that Christians should wake up to caring for the earth. His prophetic wake-up call is a premonition of what the Evil one is planning and capable of unleashing on our earth and invariably on humanity as we are experiencing in recent times.

Australia like other parts of the world is in a fair share of the doses of these Adversaries' evil deplores. While in droughts: animals, plants and crops including our lovely scenic environment were completely ravaged, pummeled and devastated. We cried for rains unending. Eventually a slight respite came.

Then came the flood that overwhelmed some parts of Australia catapulting us into an unprecedented bushfires; gassing us like rats chased and hemmed in a lair. My dear friends in Christ the good news is that there's hope. Our situation is akin to Israelites approaching Passover. Pharaoh's adamant spirit made the Passover more glorious. God's children were seriously and strongly prepared to move. Our hope is that our Passover lamb Jesus Christ will soak each door steps of your household during this Holy Week. He'll Pass over your homes, businesses, offices, hospitals, fears, sicknesses, traumas and anything that have a link to you and cleanse you.

The hosts of heavenly armies: archangels Michael, Gabriel, Raphael and our guardian angels will surround and surmount Covid-19 in the pool of the sea of Jesus' blood. Like Moses said to the people Fear not for the Egyptians you see today tomorrow you shall see them no more (Ex 14:13). I declare to you dear parishioners fear not the Covid-19 pandemics you see today tomorrow shall see it no more!

I encourage you to spend sometime rereading these passages from Exodus each day 5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14, with special attention on 15 (the big song of the Passover/Easter victory).

May the Divine Mercy of God protect and shield you. Amen.
