**SUNDAY 17<sup>th</sup> MARCH FEAST OF SAINT PATRICK**

Patrick was a 5th-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Much of what is known about Saint Patrick comes from the *Declaration*, which was allegedly written by Patrick himself. It is believed that he was born in Roman Britain in the fourth century, into a wealthy Romano-British family. His father was a deacon and his grandfather was a priest in the Christian church. According to the *Declaration*, at the age of sixteen, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Gaelic Ireland.<sup>[13]</sup> It says that he spent six years there working as a shepherd and that during this time he "found God".  
 The Declaration says that God told Patrick to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting to take him home. After making his way home, Patrick went on to become a priest. According to tradition, Patrick returned to Ireland to convert the pagan Irish to Christianity. The *Declaration* says that he spent many years evangelizing in the northern half of Ireland and converted "thousands". Patrick's efforts against the druids were eventually turned into an allegory in which he drove "snakes" out of Ireland. Tradition holds that he died on 17 March and was buried at Downpatrick.

**TUESDAY 19<sup>th</sup> MARCH FEAST OF SAINT JOSEPH**

St. Joseph was the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster father of Jesus. It is believed he was born in Bethlehem and died in Nazareth. St. Joseph played an important mission in "God's plan" of man's salvage, by accepting Jesus into his family. This put Jesus into the line of David, which according to the prophets – the Messiah would be born. He was called to act as Jesus' father and guardian. He is sometimes called the "Silent One". St. Joseph is regarded as the patron saint of workers.

This enables the community to develop a strong financial base and take the lead in managing land, as well as making decisions on how that land is used.  
 "I hope to continue living with fresh air, clean water, protected forest", Tati says, "to pay for my children's education and that my grandchildren can still enjoy the forest."
