Much loved, humble Pastor farewelled - Archbishop Francis Carroll

Thank you for your continual thoughts and prayers for Archbishop Francis Carroll. The Requiem Mass at St. Christopher's Cathedral was a beautiful send-off for our beloved Archbishop Francis Carroll. Australian Catholic Bishops Conference President, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe, has paid tribute to Archbishop Francis Carroll, "Not just a man of God, but a man for God" was how Archbishop Francis Carroll was described at a civic dinner in 2006. Archbishop Carroll died peacefully on the morning of March 14, aged 93, at Calvary Hospital in Wagga Wagga. He once said "I chose to become a priest, I accepted to be a bishop and an archbishop, but it was always with a sense of

following what I believed was a call from God. Wherever that would lead, I was happy to go."

Archbishop Francis Carroll was remembered as a man with enormous capacity for the encounter of friendship. Archbishop Prowse said "Archbishop Francis Carroll related to all of us in his long life in this face-to-face manner of the Gospel. His humility, surely one of the greatest characteristics of true leadership, warmed us to his gentle smile. He encouraged us."

CHRISM MASS - 25 March - at St. Christopher's Cathedral Canberra 5pm

The Chrism Mass, which [the Bishop] concelebrates with Priests and during which he consecrates the sacred Chrism and blesses the oils, is among the principal manifestations of the fullness of the Bishop's Priesthood and is considered to be a sign of the close bond of the Priests with him. For it is with the sacred Chrism consecrated by the Bishop that the newly baptized are anointed and those to be confirmed are signed. It is with the Oil of Catechumens that catechumens are prepared and disposed for Baptism. Finally it is with the Oil of the Sick that those who are ill are comforted in their infirmity. **ALL WELCOME TO CELEBRATE TOGETHER!**
