# Breaking Open the Word

**GOD WILL COME AND SAVE YOU** 

A myriad of images unfold God's restoration

in Isaiah: God will come and save you. These

images speak of restoration to wholeness both

to people with impairments of sight, hearing

or speech, and to a natural world ravaged by

This sounds like the Good News of God's

salvation in the Gospels. As we hear from

Mark, Jesus returns to Galilee, healing a man

described as deaf and with an impediment to

his speech. It is 'they' who brought the man

to Jesus, beseeching him to lay his hand on

him. Previously we have seen Jesus reach out

his hand to touch and heal a leper and to ask

the man with the withered hand to stretch

it out to be healed. In this instance, Jesus is

reported to take the man aside in private, that

is, 'away from the crowd'. We see Jesus touch

him, putting his fingers in his ears and on his

tongue as well as looking up to heaven in a

gesture of prayer to God saying 'Ephphatha' -

The healing is instantaneous giving an impetus

to the whole narrative, moving it forward

towards the Passion. The people who witness

this are filled with unbounded amazement.

Even though urged not to tell anyone, they

do so more and more. They acclaim Jesus in

words akin to those we heard from Isaiah of

the salvation of God. This public acclamation
