LATEST Archdiocesan Protocols COVID-19 Safety Plan
(NSW Parishes - Effective Monday 28 June 2021)

Masses, Weddings, Liturgies, Gatherings

1. Masks are mandatory for those 12 years +
2. Priest (when celebrating Liturgy) and Lectors (when proclaiming the Word) can dispense with the mask.
3. Priest and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion must wear masks when distributing the Sacred Host.
4. No congregational singing, but a cantor (x4) can sing if 4m² from congregation.
5. Holy Communion only under the species of bread.
6. Holy Communion to be received only in the hand.
7. No touching at the sign of peace.
8. Collection bags not to be passed around, but can be placed on an extended stick to allow collection of cash by a few parishioners.
9. Apply the 4m² rule to all liturgies and gatherings (except funerals).

Funerals

10. Restricted to 100 persons.

Other Matters

11. Service NSW App is mandatory.
12. Physical roster is reasonable for those who are unable to use the App (keep for 30 days).
13. Availability of hand sanitiser is essential.
14. Families can sit together, but in relation to other persons/families apply 4m² rule.

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY (NEXT SUNDAY, 25TH JULY 2021)

Pope Francis has proclaimed the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly will be celebrated on the fourth Sunday in July each year – July 25 in 2021. The Day is marked near the feast of Sts Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

In his message for the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, with the theme "I am with you always", Pope Francis said older people, even if "energy is running out", have a "renewed vocation". "It makes no difference how old you are, whether you still work or not, whether you are alone or have a family, whether you became a grandmother or grandfather at a young age or later, whether you are still independent or need assistance," he wrote. "Because there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to your grandchildren. You just need to set out and undertake something new."

"At a time of great challenges through this pandemic, we might look to our elders, neighbours and friends for their encouragement and wisdom in finding pathways through difficult times," he said. "In honouring them, we honour their lives and journeys, and open up a richness of experience to draw from. "The World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly gives the Church a chance to more deeply celebrate the role older people have played in forming us as people and as believers."
