LITURGY OF THE WORD

† A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

19: 28-40

- ²⁸ Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ When he drew near to Bethphage and Bethany at the place called the mount that is called Olivet, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰ saying, 'Go into the village opposite, whereon entering you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever yet sat; untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" you shall say this, "The Lord has need of it".
- ³² So those who were sent went away and found it as he had told them. ³³ And as they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' ³⁴ And they said, 'The Lord has need of it'.
