

- *Missionary and Evangelising*
- *Inclusive, Participatory and Synodal*
- *Prayerful and Eucharistic*
- *Humble, Healing and Merciful*
- *A Joyful, Hope-Filled and Servant Community*
- *Open to conversion, Renewal and Reform.*

“The emergence of the National Themes for Discernment is an important moment in our journey towards the Plenary Council. It is an expression of the sense of the faith from the faithful and, from this, we can proceed in our discernment of what the Spirit is saying to us in Australia,” Council Facilitator, Ms Turvey-Collins said.



FIRST READING

Prv 8:22-31

A reading from the book of Proverbs

Wisdom was born before the earth was made.

The Wisdom of God cries aloud:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works.
From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being.
The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water.
Before the mountains were settled, before the hills, I came to birth;
before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust.
When he fixed the heavens firm, I was there, when he drew a ring on the surface of the deep,
when he thickened the clouds above, when he fixed fast the springs of the deep,
when he assigned the sea its boundaries – and the waters will not invade the shore –
when he laid down the foundations of the earth, I was by his side, a master craftsman,
