God's Word reflection

Do you wonder how Abraham knew straight away that his three visitors represented in God? He runs to meet them and addresses them as 'My Lord'. Somehow, he knew that in their presence he was in the presence of God. Abraham and Sarah were no strangers to suffering and neither was Paul. Just as Abraham is happy to show hospitality to his visitors, Paul is happy to unite his suffering with that of the Christ. Somehow Paul knew that God's presence was in the suffering, and that this hidden mystery was now being revealed in Christ. They mystery is Christ is among you! Mary and Martha also came to learn this in a particular way. As it was for Abraham and Paul, Jesus teaches them that all serving must be grounded in a deep relationship of love with God. The presence of God is already with us, in the mystery of Christ. We just need to be open to knowing it, in all that we do. Just for today then, what would it be like to run to serve a stranger as if you were meeting God? How will you sit at the feet of Jesus?

First reading Genesis 18:1-10

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by.
