## REVITALISING OUR PARISH

In 2023 an average of 150 adults are attending the three weekend Masses. The reduction in people attending Mass means that Parish income has also reduced considerably.

Currently it costs \$15.85 per adult Mass goer per week to operate the Parish. Our income per adult Mass goer is an average of \$15.15 per week.

This means that the parish is forecast to run a small deficit of about \$5,500 in 2023. There are sufficient reserve funds to cover this but running deficits is not ideal. The Priests and Parish Council are incredibly grateful for all those who make a financial contribution to the Parish, no matter how big or small. More than ever before, your continued support is important. As a result we have reduced expenditure as noted below and have also decided to increase the Tap and Go minimum to \$15.00.

When the part time Parish Youth Minister resigned April 2022 a decision was made not to fill the position. Instead, a part time paid position of Music Ministry leader to assist with the Sunday evening Mass and special gatherings such as Empower was created These decisions reduced expenditure to help cope with a reduction in income. However, this type of role has a positive impact on parish activities contributing to attendance of young people at Mass and quality of liturgies.

Other significant measures to reduce

costs have also been taken. For example, the Parish Finance Officer position has been abolished. Its functions are now provided under a services agreement with the Archdiocesan finance team. This saves the Parish about \$2,000 per year in wages costs.

## First reading Ecclesiasticus 27:33-28:9

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner. He who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord, who keeps strict account of sin. Forgive your neighbour the hurt he does you, and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven. If a man nurses anger against another, can he then demand compassion from the Lord? Showing no pity for a man like himself, can he then plead for his own sins? Mere creature of flesh, he cherishes resentment; who will forgive him his sins? Remember the last things, and stop hating, remember dissolution and death, and live by the commandments. Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.

#### Resp. Psalm 94:1-2,6-9

The Lord is kind and merciful: slow to anger, and rich in compassion.

My soul, give thanks to the Lord all my being, bless his holy name. My soul, give thanks to the Lord and never forget all his blessings.

It is he who forgives all your guilt, who heals every one of your ills, who redeems your life from the grave, who crowns you with love and compassion. His wrath will come to an end; he will not be angry for ever. He does not treat us according to our sins nor repay us according to our faults.

#### Gospel Matthew 18:15-20

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time" he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me" he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.'
